

Parkhill Country Club.

Work has been commenced on the erection of a Club House for the Parkhill Country Club, at Parkhill, on the knoll south of what is familiarly known as Getty's Pond. Plans for the house have been drawn by William L. Thorne, who is a Club member, and a skillful, rising young architect.

The size of the building is 32 by 35 feet. The basement is extended 40 feet south for the bowling alleys, which will be located there, and the main floor consists of a large assembly room. The veranda extends the width of the building, in front, with a circular bay at the northeast corner. The roof is hipped. The main entrance at the north side is by a short flight of stairs to the veranda.

The house will be built on a stone foundation, with main story of shingles. The walls of the interior will be plastered, the ceiling of Georgia pine. Judging from an inspection of the plans, it will be a very pretty structure.

The Club House will be finished possibly by Christmas time. It is to be so constructed that additions may be made as warranted by the Club's growth.
